

How to Prepare for a Feng Shui Consultation

1. Determine your needs: Clarify your purpose, questions and needs in requesting a Feng Shui consultation.

2. Gather information:

- ♣ **Property address:** You will need to submit the exact address of the property you would like to be examined including directions for access.
- ♣ **Floor plan:** You will need to submit an accurate, scaled, floor plan, detailing the exact placement of doors and windows. On the plan, designate the function of each space (e.g.: living room, master bedroom, accounting office, CEO's office, storage, closets, bathroom, etc.). In case of a private house, submit the property survey as well. If you are unable to submit an adequate floor plan, you can request that your FS practitioner take all measurements and constitute a workable floor plan for an additional fee.
- ♣ **Building / house information:** the Feng Shui practitioner will need the date when the house or commercial building was first occupied (usually when the initial construction was completed) as well as the dates of all successive major renovations (such as internal or external structural changes, addition or removal of windows and doors, etc.). Usually this information can be gathered at your local town hall.
- ♣ **Personal information:** for a family's residence, provide the date of birth of the occupants, most importantly of the parents. For a place of business, provide the date of birth of the business owner(s), CEO or top manager.

3. Confidentiality: All information, floor plans and photos are kept strictly confidential.

4. General Schedule

First Visit: during this visit the Feng Shui practitioner will collect all information including on-site impressions, floor plan and survey, and take some photos.

Report: based on the information collected, the practitioner will generate a detailed report containing the Feng Shui analysis of the location, and all suggestions for modifications. The report is comprehensive, practical, and specifically tailored to respond to your particular needs and concerns.

Second visit: the practitioner will tour the location and discuss the content of the report with you on site. She will also help you understand how to apply the suggested modifications. The report is yours. The practitioner will keep a copy for reference in case you need help in the

future.

Practical details: visits lasts from one to two and a half hours for large locations. Fees include transportation to the location (within 80 kilometers from practitioner's residence), and a standard hourly rate for the visits, phone communications and report generation. It takes between 10 - 15 hours to complete a full Feng Shui service for a standard home. For locations outside the standard radius, travel fees will be additional, referral, or a long distance service might be proposed.
